**NOTICE OF RACE**

**1. Rules**

The regatta will be governed by the rules, as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* and each fleet's class rules.

**2. Eligibility**

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the J/80, J/109 class association, and a special open sprit class. Sprit class boats must meet the requirement: being a monohull sailboat which permanently use sprits or fixed bow blocks for spinnaker tacks. This would include the J105, J100, J120, and J124 classes as well as any other boat **rated 90 or less**. A 2008 PHRF certificate is required for sailboats entering the PHRF division. - 2.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached entry form and sending it with the required entry fee. This must be *received* by May 18, 2008.
- 2.3 Late entries will be accepted until June 1st with payment of the additional late entry fee.
- 2.4 Crew weigh-ins will be conducted at registration.

**3. Fees**

- 3.1 \$175.00 for US Sailing Members
- 3.2 \$185.00 for non-members of US Sailing.
- 3.3 Late entry fee of an additional \$75.00.
- 3.4 Entry fees are non-refundable.

**4. Registration**

- 4.3 Due to limited space, tickets for the BBQ must be purchased at registration. Tickets will not be available at the door.

**5. Schedule**

- 5.1 All races are scheduled to run in Noyac Bay. The starting area will be to leeward of the leeward mark, which will be set based on the prevailing conditions.
- 5.2 The first warning signal is scheduled for 1100 EDT on Saturday, May 31st. The first warning on Sunday, June 1st is scheduled for 1030 EDT.
- 5.3 The order of starts for the first race each day is scheduled as follows, but not necessarily in this order:
  - J/109
  - J/80
  - Open Sprit Class
- 5.4 Five races are scheduled. One race shall constitute a regatta.

**6. Scoring**

The low point scoring system (see RRS Appendix A) will be used except that there will be one throw out only after 5 races are completed (this modifies RRS A2).

**7. Prizes**

Prizes for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded in all classes.

**8. Sailing Instructions**

Sailing instructions will be available at registration at BYC.
